Appliances

Must be seven years old or less, clean, complete and in working order. Inclusion of operating manuals are very helpful and add value to the appliance. Examples:

- Ranges (tops and free-standing)
- Ovens (free-standing)
- Washer / dryer
- Water heaters
- Refrigerators
- Range hoods
- Microwave ovens

Architectural Items and Doors

Doors (with frames) in good condition (must not have holes, cracks, rot, etc.). Fireplace mantels, columns, antiques, in good condition are accepted.

Cabinets & Countertops

Cabinets in complete units. Must have doors, shelving, display racks, etc. Countertops must have minimal chips or damage.

Electrical

Lighting fixtures, receptacle boxes, switches, outlets, electrical parts, wire, plugs, plates, and hardware associated with electrical wiring.

Fans

Must be complete and in working condition.

Flooring Material

Tile (10 sq. ft. min.), wood, laminate, and area rugs, new carpet and padding.

Furniture

Upholstered (sofas, love seats, arm chairs, sofa beds) wood furniture, book cases and mirrors in good condition.

Insulation

New, full rolls of insulation

Plumbing

Tubs, sinks, vanities, faucets, and shower enclosures in good condition. No toilets accepted.

Plywood, Sheetrock, Lumber & Trim

Full and half sheets of plywood and drywall in good condition. Also, lumber and trim (4 ft. min.), treated or non-treated, and trim, molding.

Tools

All hand and power tools in working condition.

Windows

Minimum double panes; no single pane.

Double-hung, picture, bay – complete window units with all sashes, no rot, cracked or foggy glass. Metal and wood screens.

All merchandise must be inspected for damaged, cleaned and tested before being displayed, including removal of all nails.

Other Merchandise Possibilities

- Books
- Bicycles (in good condition)

Merchandise That Cannot Be Accepted

- Bricks
- Broken glass or mirrors
- Open or partial cans of paint, paint thinner or other hazardous chemicals
- Used toilets
- Appliances generally over 7 years
- Unframed glass
- Scrap lumber
- Garage doors
- Commercial electrical or plumbing stock
