## CAMDEN CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

**H**undreds — yes, hundreds! — of terrific volunteers have lent their energy, enthusiasm, and expertise to help build House #23, located at 5 Glenfield Circle (Lupine Terrace) in Camden. The lot was obtained by MHFH last April through cooperation with Camden Affordable Housing Organization, and marks the first time we've ever built in this Knox County town.

The project kicked off with a very busy WomenBuild for the month of May. More than 165 women turned out with sisters, mothers, daughters and friends to get the house underway. Building continued with men and women throughout the summer, with groups ranging from corporate teams, to church groups, to youth volunteers, to friends and neighbors, working together to build a decent, affordable, and safe home for a family in need.

The crisp days of fall have seen the house closed in and roofed (thank you to Horch roofing for their generous help!) and now the work continues inside.

Youth volunteers from Mid-Coast Christian Academy in Thomaston have been working every Friday afternoon, while members of the Bonneville Canyon Retreat show up faithfully many Saturdays. Bank of America has sent teams regularly throughout the past few months, and their support has been a great asset to the construction process.

With only a few months to go before our new partner family purchases the house, we need as many willing builders as possible to get the project completed. **Can you spare a day, a morning, or even several hours at the work site?**

Lots of laughter, combined with hard work, were in great abundance, and both groups enjoyed putting their beliefs into action.

All local faith communities can participate in 2012, when Midcoast Habitat introduces our inaugural **Faith Build**. This important effort will construct a home for a qualified, hardworking family to purchase via a no-interest loan. Construction will begin in late April and include twenty-four **Faith Build Saturdays**.

We will be asking members of the faith community in Knox County to participate in one common goal: Midcoast Habitat’s first Faith Build. Like many other affiliates across the country, we will be working alongside our local churches and other interfaith organizations to build a new house for a family in need. This is an excellent opportunity to have a meaningful hands-on, practical mission in your own back yard.

The level of commitment to be a **Faith Build** sponsor and participant will require a monetary commitment of \$2500 and a volunteer of one Saturday work day or more. Faith groups can partner together if they choose.

We gather in faith at the start of each construction day. We work our faith to provide decent affordable housing for a deserving family. Truly — we are building on Faith!
